

# Faith, Meet Ted and Karen Peters

The interim period between pastors at Faith Lutheran Church provides an opportunity for us in the congregation to assess the strengths and weaknesses of our current program, to discern the directions to which the Holy Spirit may be calling us, and to plan for the next phase of our parish mission. While we are engaged in this long range planning, Pastor Ted will provide transition pastoral services. Karen will be available to make contributions upon invitation.

Pastor Ted's full name is Theodore F. Peters. He was ordained into the Lutheran ministry on April 30, 1970. He served as pastor to Trinity Lutheran Church on the south side of Chicago in the early 1970s, and

he places his fictional action thriller, For God and Country, in this Chicago neighborhood. In addition, he has conducted summer ministries at Diamond Point Community Church near Lake George in upstate New York since 1974, a part-time ministry he has maintained to the present day. He has served interim pastorates in South Carolina and Louisiana as well.

Much of his professional life has been given to the teaching ministry, most of which has taken place at our ELCA seminary in Berkeley. In 1978 he was called to teach women and men preparing for the ministry as well as those preparing to become university professors at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in conjunction with the Graduate Theological Union. ### Faith Lutheran Church Treasurer's Report February 28, 2017

The total General (non-Designated) income for February 2017 was \$11,773.94 Year to date was \$23,039.10.

The General expenses for February were \$5,850.30 Year to date was \$19,266.93.

The total net income for February was \$5,923.64 Year to date net income was \$3,772.17.

The amount transferred and paid to the Benevolence was \$588.93 (was paid in March)

Special funds received were \$100.00 for Campus Maintenance, \$1,498.00 from the Wine & Food Fest, \$67.00 from Dine & Donate, \$21.16 From Memorial (Ruth & Bob Bell), \$50.00 from Key Replacement, \$10.00 from India's Necklaces, \$18.94 from Amazon Smile, \$23.56 from Scrip and \$25.00 from Flowers.

- Offering donations for February were over budget by 232.17 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 3), and year-to-date they were under budget by 326.20. (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 6) Revelations & OuickBooks have not been reconciled yet.

### HISTORY OF FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH

- excerpted from Ruth Bell Church History

THIS IS DEDICATED TO ALL OF THE SAINTS OF FAITH EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH OF SANTA ROSA WHO MADE THES WRITTEN WORDS POSSIBLE.

21ST Century-- Here we Come! This is where we have been.

As we approach the twenty-first century, we celebrate our heritage by looking at the past forty years that we have been known as Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church.

There will be names of some that we have forgotten, some who have died, some who have moved away and those who have joined us and will celebrate with us.

The congregation began with four families: The Rev. & Mrs. Robert Freistedt, Mr. & Mrs. Daniel White, Dr. and Mrs. Robert C. Bell Jr., and Mr. & Mrs. Lyle Christensen, who met at the Service of Ordination May 15, 1960 at St. Marks Lutheran Church in San Francisco for Pastor Freistedt, who was designated mission developer in Santa Rosa for the United Lutheran Church in America. Those on the steering committee were: Pastor Freistedt, Robert Bell, Jim Nelson, Eva Vaughan, Helmut Klee, Lyle Christensen and Dan White. Our congregation met at 1411 Carlos Court in Rincon Valley. The first service of our mission congregation took place Oct. 16, 1960 at the Luther Burbank Art and Garden Center, our church for four years.

The "Name the Church" contest was won by Dan White, Helmut Klee and Stephen Bell.

The first child baptized into our congregation was Terry Williams, Nov. 6, 1960.

"Faith Lutheran Taking Final Organization Steps" were the words in the local newspaper. It begins with the signing of the Charter by 70 adults and 10 confirmands. Little did we know that the roll would be open for signing until we built our first church in 1964. Our first service was held with 140 in attendance. Bethlehem choir sang. Lily Greer had returned from her trip to Europe to help Dorothy White with h music. I still miss Dorothy's "Oh toot" who she would hit the wrong key. Our coffee time had been called a time when the "sweetest aroma of fellowship fills the air. Stay a few moments after service and let us become acquainted with you.

The Board of American Missions of the United Lutheran Church in America purchased property on Hwy. 12 as a site to build our new church for \$49,000 (needless to say, it was not built there.)

On May 7 we had our Service of Organization. The Board of American Missions of the United Lutheran Church in Americas sent us a letter of congratulations, as did the other fellow churches Dr. C.V. Tambert of the Southwest Synod gave the sermon and officiated at the installation of the church council. They were Dr. Robert Bell, Robert Bills, Roy Besser, Elmer Elvig, Helmut Klee, James Nelson, William Schmidt, Eva Vaughan and Daniel White.

By this time Mrs. Allen Parson had joined the ranks of the musicians. The first confirmation class had the following members. Blythe Allen (Babb), Billie Jean Block, Robert Bell III, Brian Compton, Eldred Compton, William Kent Davis, Dennis Neiblas, and Stephen Robinson.

Pastor Freistedt and lay delegates, Mr. & Mrs. Daniel White attended the convention of the ELC and we were officially accepted in to the Southwest Synod.

Bill Schmidt headed our first stewardship program. Our choir was organized under the direction of Lily Greer. The young people started the Luther League Program which we now know as F.L.Y. We grow. We had our usual picnics, potlucks, social hours, and special films (no videos then). In August a two week VCS was held with 40 students and 10 teachers. There were always special services to celebrate church holidays.



Moreover, some women of our company amazed us. They were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; and they came back saying that they had even seen a vision of angels, who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb, and found it was just as the women had said; but him they did not see.
