

Treasurer's Report
December 30, 2016**

The total General (non-Designated) income for December was \$11,508.75
Year to date was \$146,016.95.

The General expenses for December were \$9,474.68
Year to date was \$151,159.36.

The total income for December was \$2,034.07
Year to date deficit was \$5,142.41.

The amount transferred and paid to the Benevolence was \$546.17 (was no paid yet)

Special funds received were \$5,527.00 for Campus Maintenance, \$50.00 for Deacon's fund, \$20.00 from Cook Book sales, \$10.00 for Choir fund, \$41.10 from Shopping Spree and \$12.52 from Scrip.

- 1) Offering donations for December were under budget by 480.58 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 3), and year-to-date they were over budget by 1,948.97. (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 6) Revelations & QuickBooks have not been reconciled yet.
- 2) Total income for December was under budget by 918.94 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 3), and year-to-date they were under budget by 3,115.30 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 6)
- 3) Total expenses for December were under budget by 2,403.39 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, 3rd to last line, column 3), and year-to-date were over budget by 8,622.36 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, 3rd to last line, column 6).
- 4) Net income for December was over budget by 1,484.45 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 3), and year-to date were under budget by 11,737.66 (see page 5 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 6).
- 5) You will notice Notes, Mortgages & Leases 27.1 does not have a new balance. I have not received the bill yet. \$438,425.09 is the balance due on the Pre-School mortgage. (see page 2 of the Balance Sheet, 10th line from the bottom, column 1)
- 6) The breakdown of the amounts in the Memorial fund as of December \$70.00 Ms Antonio, \$35.00 Kensinger, and \$75.00 Mathwig.
- 7) You will also notice that the Asset Campus Maintenance Fund and the Restricted Campus Maintenance fund does not balance. This is because in the Accounts payable is the balance still due for the gas leak of \$3,285.84. Also in the Accounts payable is the payment for the Benevolence in the amount of \$546.17.
- 8) The expenses are less this month because I have not paid the Pension & Benefits in the amount of \$2,665.25.



Faith Lutheran Church Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes, Part II

January 22, 2017

CALL TO ORDER and Opening Prayer (Laurie Wennes/Chris Carson) 11:18AM

I. Additions/Changes to Agenda (see attached).
Approved by show of hands.

II. Approval of January 2016 Annual Meeting Minutes (m/s/p Linda Coffman./Kathy Corsiglia.).
Approval of December 2016 Annual Meeting Minutes (m/s/p Linda Coffman./Kathy Corsiglia.).

III. Financial Report (see attached). Discussion: \$3,753 in checking account; we cannot use restricted funds (for other than restricted purpose).

IV. Treasurer's Report (see attached).

V. Thanksgiving Lutheran: President opened the floor for discussion whether to continue to alternate worship on last Sunday of each month with Thanksgiving Lutheran Church. Discussion: pros and cons. We will continue to share and exchange in social fellowship (Wine Fest, Camp Michaela, etc.); and perhaps alternate hosting of VBS, Oktoberfest, etc. These great ideas need to be headed up by someone who is willing to organize. We need to commit to attend their functions as we hope they will support ours. Resolved to continue the conversation. Motion to continue alternating worship on last Sunday of each month: Kathryn Miller, seconded by Kathy Corsiglia. By show of hands, the motion was defeated. Additionally, motion to continue to allow pets in the sanctuary for worship, by aNna rybaT, seconded by Patti Gillhooley, was, by show of hands, defeated (except for service animals).

VI. Proposed Budget (see attached with changes due to Pastor Carnahan's resignation). Discussion: PG&E Bill for Nov. and Dec. was \$1,100. Pre-School and Living Roots pay their own. We need to help one another and remember to turn off lights and keep temp. turned low when not in use. We cannot consider solar at this time due to condition of the roof. Approved (m/s/p Jeanine D./Cathy C.), with one vote against.

VII. Report on the Council Meeting with Pastor Kathryn Gulbranson, assistant to the Bishop of Sierra Pacific Synod on January 17, 2017: FLC will have a list of candidates for Pulpit services (temporary: pd. \$225 per Sunday) while we consider a list of candidates supplied by Synod as Interim Pastors. We will form a Call committee (separate from the Council) and develop a Profile of what characteristics we are looking for, based on our congregation's values and vision for the future. The Interim Pastor will be paid based on a negotiated salary, but we will need to provide salary, health and housing benefits, as we would for a full time Pastor (unless we choose to hire a part-time Pastor). The Council will approve the selection of the Interim Pastor (with input from the Congregation). Lauren Morris suggested we consider Pastor Jean for part-time Interim Pastor, if we decide to use part-time v. full time Pastor. President offered that Redeemer Presbyterian Church has expressed interest in sharing our sanctuary/facilities. The property where they currently worship is being sold. They are a small congregation of 50 – 60 members. Council will explore this opportunity and keep the congregation posted. Sharing with another denomination would help keep us resilient and responsive to our common ministry.

VIII. Council for 2017: Laurie Wennes (President), Ernie Engle (VP & Christian Ed.), Kathy Corsiglia, Mary Seefeldt (Sharing Faith), India Geibel (Financial Admin.), Connie Duncan (Treasurer), aNna rybaT (Secretary), Ed Rybat (Bldg. & Grounds), Chris Carson and Steve Nelson. Un-committed: Cherie Marie Barnett. Terri Abramson will not continue this year in Social Ministry. The Council will finalize at next meeting, Feb. 21.

Closing prayer: Please keep the Bell family in prayer as Bob died this morning, one month after his wife; keep Betty Engle in prayer, released from hospital.


