ELCA & LCMS provided gift certificates to distribute with over \$18,000 provided to Lutheran churches in the areas affected by the fires.

The Annual Chili Feed in January became a Farewell Potluck for Pastor TIm & family. Our Interim Pastor Ted and wife Karen brought a welcome presence to our worship and church life, while the Call Committee began the work of finding a replacement (we will be lucky to find someone so loved as Karen and Ted). Karen led us in Town Hall

In February our Winter Wine Fest was well attended. Our cooks did a fabulous job making a variety of different foods to sample. We repaired the worst of the roof damage, thanks to the congregation rising to meet the goals of our Campus Maintenance Fund. The roofs on the sanctuary and other buildings still need to be replaced within next few years (est. \$40,000), but we have averted more serious damage for now. The cross on the sanctuary had to be removed due to wood rot and hopefully, will be replaced soon.

The old carpeting in Charter Hall was replaced with a beautiful floor, courtesy Marcus Meyers, from one of the groups who meets on Mondays. Thank you Betty and Ernie Engle for the huge success of the Pancake Breakfast on Easter Morning!

Under Ernie and Betty Engle's leadership, we renewed the Sunday School teaching of our youth, including a hugely successful Camp Big Oak in August. Chris Carson is teaching the children to sing. To celebrate the 500th year of Martin Luther's posting the 95 Theses, Pastor David helped us understand the catechism of Martin Luther and deepen our understanding of the Bible each Sunday morning before worship. For such a small volunteer group, the choir under the direction of Janice Hall, enhanced our worship experience with amazing beautiful voices ("One who sings prays twice").

VBS was a big hit in July with over 20 children in attendance. The children brought in canned food and backpacks and school supplies to help the less fortunate children in the community. Kathryn Miller generously donated \$160 in proceeds from the sale of her newly published book, *Ring Around Reality*.

The homeless Camp Michela has grown and over Thanksgiving week, about 70 souls were fed! We collected for Toys For Tots, and started up a new Book Club. Men and Women of Faith met at iHop every Tuesday for fellowship and returned the proceeds of Dine & Donate to Noe (faithful waiter) who lost his home in the fires. The men met each first Wednesday of the month for fellowship and food. The Pre-School is humming along smoothly with a full house of busy toddlers, thanks to hard work donated by Steve Norton, Ed Rybat, Steve Gaultney, John Hall, John Morris, Norm Nielsen, Chris Carson and others.

India, our Parish Administrator began writing Grace Notes each week, filling the void of Pastor Tim's weekly notes. Her stories were little devotions in themselves. We hosted another Yard Sale to raise funds for Campus Maintenance and sponsored another Car Show in memory of long time beloved member, Lloyd Koonst.

One new soul baptized in to the Kingdom in November: Mathew James Abraham, born May 6. Sing Hallelujah!

Lastly, in December the Altar Guild will decorate the sanctuary once again for the Advent Season. We give thanks for the promise of the birth of our Savior and look forward to the New Year with a fresh sense of purpose.

#### Faith Lutheran Church Treasurer's Report October 31, 2017

The total General (non-Designated) income for October 2017 was \$12,863.75 Year to date was \$116,341.30

The General expenses for October were \$10,025.01 Year to date was \$101,112.62.

The total income for October was \$2,838.74 Year to date net income was \$15,228.68.

The amount transferred and paid to the Benevolence was \$608.87 (was paid in November)

Special funds received were \$2,480.00 for Campus Maintenance, \$20.00 from Dine & Donate, \$290.00 for Deacon Fund, \$40.00 for Reformation Book, \$100.00 from Thrivent choice dollar, \$21.65 from Scrip and \$90.00 from Flowers.

- Offering donations for October were over budget by 564.42 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 3), and year-to-date they were under budget by 2,528.59 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, line 1, column 6) Revelations & QuickBooks have not been reconciled yet.
- 2) Total income for October was over budget by 561.06 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 3), and year-to-date they were under budget by 6,685.57 (see page 1 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 6)
- 3) Total expenses for October were under budget by 2,388.17 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, 3<sup>rd</sup> to last line, column 3), and year-to-date were under budget by 23,024.22 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, 3<sup>rd</sup> to last line, column 6).
- 4) Net income for October was over budget by 2,949.23 (see page 4 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 3), and year-to date were over budget by 16,338.65 (see page 5 of the Income & Expense Budget Performance, last line, column 6).
- 5) You will notice Notes, Mortgages & Leases 27.1 has a balance of 418,605.86. This is the balance due on the Pre-School mortgage.(see page 2 of the Balance Sheet, 10<sup>th</sup> line from the bottom, column 1)

## FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH HISTORY

**1970 -** reprinted from Mrs. Ruth Bell's notes

Again we find ourselves without a pastor, but the work of the church goes on. Thank goodness, we have competent lay people and interim pastors, Ed Hummon, and John Zeltin. The church calendar continues along the same lines. In April, Mr. George Falk accepted our call. He was ordained on June 14 in Concord. Several families from our congregation attended Pastor Falk's ordination. He was installed on the 21st of June. A reception followed for the Reverend Fan, his wife Ethel and their four children, Patricia, Cynthia, George and Katherine. Fortunately our parsonage was large enough for them. New things were happening. The contemporary Service of Worship and Celebration was introduced and became our regular service at 8:30AM.

A newly - organized parent cooperative nursery was started for children in the three year old group. This was not run by our congregation. The Reverend Edward Hummon (retired) and his wife Mildred joined our congregation. God knew we needed him.

In September, the Council went on retreat to write a "Statement of Purpose" (one of many) for our church.

Our hearts were saddened by the death of Thomas Kjeldgard.

The Altar Guild seems to do its work quietly, behind the scenes. Those that prepare the altar for Sunday worship services are Emma Chance, Edith Ricker, Esther Christensen, Dee Pearson, Elaine Finger, Mildred Hummon, Sandra Wilkening, Ethel Falk and Donna Besser. Some have done this for years.

There is always something to do on the property, re-staining the buildings, picnic tables, repainting parking stripes, and refinishing doors. you should have seen the look on some of the faces when they saw the blue doors. Arrangements were made with a neighbor to use the back acreage for his livestock. This solved our weed problem in that area. The youth group erected a basketball hoop for its own use and for the benefit of the neighborhood.

With no paid janitor, it was up to the congregation to keep the buildings clean. We have done so with our parish care groups.

The LCW continued to have their regular activities

Bible Study, hosting receptions, etc. Besides the Mother/Daughter Luncheon this year, the LCW prepared a banquet for a Father/Son evening. Dr. George Rostel showed his abilities as a magician. Esther Christensen was elected delegate to Asilomar. after two years of baking cookies for our servicemen [sic] it (fortunately) was time to stop. Yvonne Hudson had charge of collecting and packaging these boxes, and probably baked dozens. Doris His was president.

Carol Parson (Sergeant) headed the Luther League program ice skating and ski trip to Boreal started off the year. Later there was a swim party and a return to get some of Mrs. Emmesl's "famous" tacos, plus kite flying. and camp-outs . Sounds like fun time. A "kidnapping party" welcomed the Falk kids. Not all was fun and games. The youth found that a car wash was a very successful undertaking. The money earned went to defray some of the church organ's repair costs. In the fall a new set of guidelines were drawn up. The former Luther League is now referred to FAITH YOUTH!!! Year's end found them caroling, praving, and presenting the traditional nativity scene. Carol parson (Sergeant) was their leader.



# A Reading from Matthew 24: 36

But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but he Father only. As were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they did not know until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of man. Then two men will be in the field: one is taken and one is left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one is

taken and one is left. Watch therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.
