



HELP FOR WILDFIRE VICTIMS

Don't you just feel awful every time you hear about the latest tragedy caused by Northern California's wildfires? Maybe it's sadness you feel because of the unnecessary loss of life. Or maybe it's anger because California has already suffered more than enough tragedy in recent years. Or maybe it's helplessness because you believe there's nothing you can do to make a difference.

But what if you could make a difference? What if you could help provide for someone's immediate needs after they lost everything? What if you could help someone access counseling and resources so they can better process their experience? If you could do these things, wouldn't you?

It's perfectly normal to feel saddened or even angry in the wake of such devastation, but you don't have to feel helpless. You *can* do something. You can join with LSS and with others who refuse to stand by idly and watch wildfires destroy homes and lives. To those who've already donated to LSS' 2018 Wildfire Relief Fund, thank you! We have already raised \$10,275, and because of your generosity, \$5000 worth of \$100 gift cards has been dispatched to those affected by the wildfires to provide for their immediate needs. But, for most, the journey to recovery will be long and there is still a great deal of work to be done.

Perhaps you've tried to ignore Northern California's wildfires or pretend it isn't happening. But you couldn't. Images of ashes scattering the ground where someone's home once stood and scorched hillsides dominate our television and cell phone screens. No, you can't ignore it. And it is happening.

Every day you get an update on what percentage of each fire is contained, but it's never enough. It doesn't bring back someone's wife or grandchild. It doesn't heal the brokenness that lingers after someone witnesses their home burn to the ground. It doesn't provide for someone's immediate needs after losing everything. It doesn't change anything. But you can.

1978 reprinted from Mrs. Ruth Bell's notes

Will Gritter was elected to serve as Council resident for a second term. Newly elected members were Emile Emmel, Gene Darling, Thomas Reinecke and Marianne Wilson.

Will Gritter wrote in his report that 1978 can be seen as a time in which we tried, among other things, to be caring people of God.

Over 40 people attended our "Soup, Salad and Scholar." This was Dr. Goese's series on "Theology of the Cross vs. theology of Glory."

Evangelism Chairman {sic} Elaine Finger, wrote that the committee visited inactive and active members as well as prospective members. New member packets, including keys to the church, were handed out to 31 new members.

Yes, we had a volleyball team. Judy and Tom Reinecke were in charge and the team won the league championship.

Sammie Allen was responsible for the "profiles" of new members in the church "Link" each month.


This was the year we purchased 125 new green hymnals, the "Lutheran Book of Worship." Many members gave hymnals in honor of or in memory of friends and loved ones. We started using them the first Sunday in Advent.

The Men's Club was active as well. Mick Anderson wrote that the meetings were a very relaxed type and the discussions were on a variety of subjects (no change there). The men did serve Easter breakfast and this year they served soup and sandwiches at the Country Faire held at our church in December. Monies were given towards the purchase of tables.

Terry Finger served as president of Faith Lutheran youth. Fun time was a trip to San Francisco for dinner, a snow trip and a Valentine Dance. Activities included an Encounter Group dealing with drugs and alcohol led by Diane Warner, visiting the ladies at Sonoma State Hospital, a car wash and fixing the nursery. Grant Doering, Val Peterson and the Proknows were sponsors.






A Reading From: Mark 1: 21 - 28
