CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE:

The first major task is to complete the Ministry Site Profile, MSP. It is this document that is used by the Synod to start selecting candidates and needs to be a true representation of Faith Lutheran Church.

In July 2017 we began to approach this task with the idea of possibly including Thanksgiving Lutheran someway, somehow by considering a shared part-time pastor at both churches, or if we merged, by having only one pastor at one merged site. Neither of these ideas has panned out.

Additionally, significant changes and events have occurred in these 14 months; the loss of Helen O'Donnell the chair of our call committee, the Oct 9th fires, Thanksgiving Lutheran moving out of their building and renting space at Knox Presbyterian, retirement of Pastor Jean at Thanksgiving, the sharing of our campus with Redeemer Presbyterian. Since the MSP is meant to reflect what we are as a church, these events have had to be considered or included in our writing. Even so most of the MSP preparation done thus far is still applicable.

At the September Council meeting the **Council** gave the Call Committee the direction to pursue our search independently, "go it alone". Thanksgiving Lutheran is many months behind in their call process and we need to move ahead.

We now need to make the modifications to the MSP with this in mind and with the budget also provided to us by the council. Once completed the Council will be able to see it and a copy will be available in the office for interested congregants to read.

The Synod will then start their process of selecting candidates for the Call Committee to consider.

However, as events unfold, yet another modified version of our MSP may be required and we need to be open to this possibility. But for now we will move ahead with the understanding that we are looking for a parttime pastor for just Faith Lutheran Church.



FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH HISTORY -

1979 reprinted from Mrs. Ruth Bell's notes

1979 began with Chuck Hammond being elected President of the Church Council. Chuck was to serve on Council for many years and as we go into the 21st century, he is still among the leaders of Faith Lutheran Church. Newly elected councilman were Val Peterson, Debra Hammond, Gordon Stedman and Eileen Flater. Bob Bell and Betty Freeman have been serving as Treasurer and Financial Secretary, respectively. Pastor Flak writes in his report for the annual meeting, "We have many people working together to carry out the various functions of the Body of Christ within the congregation. We have a pastor, worship assistants, acolytes, ushers, altar guild, choir members, musicians, teachers, organizers, typers, staplers, mimeographers, folders, filers, cleaners, counters, checkbook writers, attendance takers, people who sing, people who pray and worship, people who give up their time, abilities and their money. It takes all of this for the Body of Christ to function at 4930 Newanga." (Twetnty years later, in this computer age, things haven't changed much.) It was a busy year for the Women of Faith. There were three circles that met monthly and four general meetings at which outside speakers were invited. For several past years (and years to come) they provided tray favors and goodies monthly to the patients at Santa Rosa Convalescent Home. Cecilia Procknow was Christian Action Chairman. A successful Mother-Daughter luncheon was held. Fellowship for all members was a "Food Fair." Emily Emmel and Eileen Flater were the chairmen for this event. Afterwards, it was hoped that it would be an annual affair.

This year, Lily Greer was elected President of Lutheran Church Women. She has also served as choir director for the past nineteen years and was council secretary for six years.

1979 was a god year for our church. The Executive Board reported that we experienced growth, spiritually, financially and numerically. Our council and congregation have continued to show love and concern toward people and needs throughout the congregation and community. Twenty-nine new members were welcomed into the church. Sammy Allen had a busy year as she headed the Evangelism committee. Coffee continues to be served at the After Church Social Hour, added an ad in the Press Democrat, made name tags for every members attending the four Sundays of June, had a faithful group of callers, had a photo made of the Council members (with various responsibilities noted), had photos of our new Saints in the narthex, assigned Share and Care Coordinator, wrote membership profiles for the "LINK" and had shepherding couples for each new family. We honored new members with a flower when they joined, a membership packet and a get acquainted pot luck dinner. New members were truly welcomed into the Family of Faith.


